What is ClassDojo Portfolios and How Does it Work?

ClassDojo Portfolios is a digital student portfolio that allows students to share classwork with their teachers and family! Students can add to their portfolio using Chromebooks, laptops, and iOS/Android devices. Teachers can view and approve student work on Portfolios using any device!



Students create and upload photos, videos, drawings, and journal entries through ClassDojo, and can also upload Microsoft Office files, PDFs, and image files from any laptop.

Teachers can also use Activities to assign projects directly to student devices to which students can respond.

This is how we will provide pupils with their learning activities for each day after they begin COVID isolation.

Teachers will follow the school timetable as close as possible and provide documents, worksheets, photos or links to provided lessons for the day.

Children also need to read daily and practice multiplication tables.

Access to Class Dojo Portfolio.

The good news is that if you already use Class Dojo, there are no extras to add. The only thing that children will need to do is log on using their individual login method. In most cases, this is via their personal QR code which logs them in to their own portfolio.

They will have been given a copy and you will have also received an email with it.

From here they can access work set and also respond by uploading documents and photos.

Each day, children will log on and find their activities for the day.

Teachers may use written explanations or video clips to help children understand what it is they have to do. They may also post links to video lessons such as White Rose Maths for you to follow.

Google Classroom (Years 5 and 6)



In years 5 and 6 the teachers will be using Google classrooms. This is a well-used and well known method of providing remote learning to children. Our teachers have been receiving training in how to use it effectively and feel this will be more suitable and flexible for the older year groups. The children can manage their own work, hand in from any device with the app or they can login online.

Children in year 5 and 6 will be shown how to use Google classroom and should be clear how to access their accounts should they be away from school.
