#### **FOREST SCHOOL**

We are thrilled to share an update on the incredible learning and growth happening at our Forest School. In the last few weeks, pupils have been busy with a wide range of activities, including:

Creative Construction: A popular activity has been denbuilding, where children collaborate to build shelters using natural materials like branches and leaves. This has fostered teamwork, problem-solving, and communication skills.

Sensory Exploration: The mud kitchen has been a hive of activity, with children creating "gourmet mud dishes" and developing their imagination through messy play.





Nature's Mysteries: Pupils have become keen investigators, going on scavenger hunts for mini-beasts and different types of leaves and plants. This has helped them observe the changing seasons and understand the local ecosystem.





As the seasons change, our outdoor classroom will provide a unique and inspiring setting for children to develop confidence, resilience, and a deep connection with the natural world.

## SCHOOL COUNCIL FUNDRAISER: HALLOWEEN DRESSING UP DAY

To raise money for School Council projects, pupils have asked to once again have a Halloween dressing up day. Therefore, for a 50p donation (bucket collection at drop-off), on **Friday 31st October**, children are invited to come to school in a Halloween themed outfit.

<u>Please don't feel the need to purchase expensive</u> <u>costumes</u>. It's basically non-uniform, so children who don't wish to dress in Halloween costumes can simply wear Autumnal/Halloween colours to school – grey, orange, green, red, black etc.

Could we request that pupils leave scary masks and accessories, such as sickles, cauldrons and broomsticks at home. We'd also ask that pupils don't wear face paint and put dye in their hair as these are further added distractions in the classroom.

The theme aims to empower children and young people to use their influence to speak out against bullying, support others, and create more inclusive communities.

To join in with the ABA campaign, <u>pupils are asked to</u> <u>wear their 'Odd Socks' on Monday 10th November in</u> order to express themselves and celebrate their individuality!

#### **REMINDERS ...**

**WRAPPING UP WARM:** The weather is turning so could all children please bring in a suitable coat for the colder/wetter months. <u>Please</u> make sure the coat is labelled with your child's name. Thank you.

**SCHOOL DINNERS:** Could I politely remind parents that meals **must** be booked on Relish by midnight each Sunday for the week in advance. Bookings for the entire half-term can also be completed. No late bookings can be taken - any meal orders placed after the deadline will not show up on our system.

MESSAGING VIA CLASS DOJO OR EMAIL: All school staff will be happy to respond to messages sent in by parents within 2 working days. However, please be mindful that staff are not expected to monitor or respond to messages out of their normal working hours (including Friday night, weekends and published school holidays). Please do not send absence/ appointment or collection messages via Class Dojo, a phonecall or email to the office should be made.

#### **KEY STAGE 2 - SPARE OUTDOOR SHOES REQUEST**

To avoid an increase in potential accidents on the Key Stage 2 playground due to 'overcrowding', we endeavour to use the field throughout the whole year, weather permitting. So that pupils do not trample mud and grass into school, pupils who would like to play on the field at breaktimes and lunchtimes will be asked to change into 'outdoor shoes' that should be kept in a bag on pegs.

These shoes should be different to both their everyday school shoes *and* the trainers worn for outdoor PE. They will get muddy! Trainers, old baseball /Converse boots, old shoes, wellies will be fine. Please ensure property is labelled.

### REPORTING YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE

A request from the office ... if you leave an answer message to report your child's absence, please could you tell us specifically what their illness is rather than 'poorly', this will help us to monitor patterns in tummy bugs, coughs, colds etc. Thank you.

Please could we request that unless you are unavoidably delayed in traffic at the last minute, that messages regarding a change in collection/home-time arrangements are received by the office by 2.45pm.
