Homework

- Reading Pupils are expected to read regularly at home. It is important that school books taken home come back each day; if there are any issues with the book selected, please feel free to contact me. We are very much looking forward to the term ahead and to all the exciting activities we have planned.

Literacy: This half term, we will be covering a range of genres that include revisiting instructions and then looking at a traditional tale for story writing and finally creating a brochure all about Castle Donington.

Numeracy: In mathematics we will complete our unit of work on fractions and then move on to statistics where we will be linking the data to dinosaurs and our topic 'Jurassic World'. We will also be looking at measure, telling the time, finally moving on to shape and position and direction.

Science: Pupils will be investigating living and non-living things for Jurassic World and also explore different habitats and food chains.

Topics (History, Geography, Music, PSHE, RE, Art, DT): Our topic this half term concludes the topic 'Jurassic World' where we continue to find out about dinosaurs and what they ate and design our own dinosaur. . We are working over several weeks to produce a mixed media collage with includes detailed sketches of fossils. We will also be learning lots of different dinosaur songs. The children will learn how dinosaurs became extinct and the different theories behind it. Finally, we will end Jurassic World with a special visit from a surprise visitor! After half-term, we move on to' Donington Detectives' where we will find out about our local area. As a geography-based unit. This will involve fieldwork and map work.

PE: We will be teaching dribbling and striking as object manipulation in Basketball, Hockey and Football.

Computing: In computing, we will be learning keyboard and mouse skills. As well as this, we will also be learning how to programme sprites, debug and understand algorithms (early stages of program design). This will be completed on a programme called Scratch Jr.
