

Numeracy

- Create a questionnaire about favourite sea creatures and ask the members of your family or friends. Can you use tally marks to record their answers? Which sea creature is the most/least popular?
- Can you use measuring jugs/cups at home to read the amounts of liquid different containers hold? E.g. An egg cup holds__ ml of water.



Out and About!

- Name the world's oceans and seas. Can you locate these onto a World Map?
- Visit a local garden centre or Aquarium and record what you could see using pictures and words.
- Go on a local walk and collect a range of leaves, sticks and other items that you might find. Can you use them to create a natural picture of a sea creature?



Literacy

- Read a sea themed story. Can you describe the main characters or one of the sea creatures that is in the story?
- Write a poem about life Under the Sea. Maybe you could perform your poem to an audience at home.
- Write a list of sea creatures that you know.
- Write your own under the sea story. What is going to happen? Will it be a happy or sad ending?
- Create your own sea creature and use adjectives to describe it.
- Write a fact file about your favourite sea creature.



Working with Others

- Create an Under the Sea quiz. Can you write 10 questions to challenge an adult in your family?
- Create a game of Under the Sea snap! Draw matching pictures of different sea creatures onto paper or card and then use them in your game of snap.
- Work with a friend to design a new invention to take you underwater. What will it be made of? How many people will fit in it? Will it have any special features?

(Each bullet point is one activity)

Expressive Arts

- Sand Art! Use food colouring to colour sand. Can you then make a sea themed picture using the coloured sand?
- Learn and perform a song with a sea theme: Under the Sea from The Little Mermaid is a good one to start with.
- Use different materials to create your own under the sea collage.
- Use junk modelling or craft materials to make your very own sea creature. What will you use for the scales?
- Draw/Paint your favourite sea creature. Can you add any detail by using different art materials?

Let's Get Technical!

- Use a range of materials to construct a boat. Does it float? Can you explain why?
- Complete a float or sink experiment in your bathtub or sink. Test out ten different items and record your findings.
- Use the internet to search for pictures of different sea creatures.



Health and Wellbeing

- Make a poster to tell people how they can look after the sea.
- Play 'Guess the animal' by moving like a sea creature for others to guess.
- Can you research into the foods that we eat that come from the ocean? Which foods do you like? Are there any foods that you haven't eaten?

Social Studies

- Carry out some research into the Great Barrier Reef – can you find out what's happening to it? What can we do to help?
- Watch some videos about plastic pollution. What effect is it having on the environment? Can you write a list of 5 changes we can make to look after our oceans?
