

## Numeracy

- Make a tally of the birds you can see in your garden. Which is the most common type of bird?



- Can you order woodland animals based on their length or height? Which is the longest woodland animal? Which is the shortest?
- Using the tally can you count in twos to see how many legs there are altogether?

## Out and About!

- Make a list of the birds you can see in your garden.
- Go to your local park and look out for different habitats. E.g. can you spot a fox hole/den or bird's nests etc.
- Have a go at making your own minibeast hotel using a range of materials.



## Literacy

- Write a journey or warning story about a woodland creature.
- Create a fact file about a chosen woodland creature. Can you include at least 5 interesting facts?
- Write a riddle about a woodland creature and see if your adult can guess what animal you are referring to.
- Can you use adjectives to describe a woodland setting?

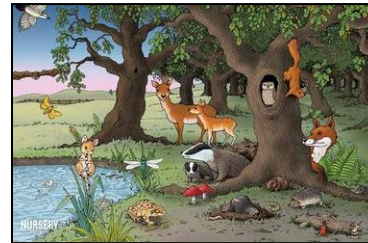


## Working with Others

## Expressive Arts

- Using natural materials found in your garden or local area to create your own natural artwork.

- Make a woodland animal mask using collage materials.
